

THE CABINS AT DRY CREEK

The Ozark Folk Center is home to The Cabins at Dry Creek. Located in the park just downhill from the Skillet Restaurant, these cabins provide modern, comfortable accommodations. Rooms are ground level, and designed as duplex pods. Some rooms have a secure pass-through door allowing guests the option of combining rooms. All rooms sleep 2-4 people and have a private bathroom, telephone, microwave, mini-fridge, coffee pot, WiFi, and satellite television. Large windows and glass doors open onto a small outdoor seating area, most with a scenic wooded view.

The Cabins at Dry Creek office has a game room and an outdoor swimming pool (open May 1 to October 1) nearby to entertain guests of any age. Cabin guests may visit the Cabin Office to purchase tickets at discounted prices for Craft Village and Ozark music events. The Cabin Office also offers a small gift shop open year-round.

WELCOME TO THE OZARK FOLK CENTER STATE PARK

Where we perpetuate, present, and promote the Ozark way of life in an educational and enjoyable manner. Come experience the craft demonstrations, music programs, the Heritage Herb Garden, workshops, and many special events that represent our culture.

Located in Mountain View, Arkansas. The Ozarks region offers densely forested plateaus cut through by streams and rivers in deep valleys. Stone County remains a unique living Ozark culture. Residents enjoy sharing their love of music, making things by hand, and visiting with folks from around the world. The state park is fully open Tuesday through Saturday mid April through October, with additional events, workshops, and The Cabins at Dry Creek open year around.

THE CRAFT VILLAGE

The Craft Village features more than 20 working artisans in individual shops making, demonstrating, and selling their handcrafted works. Crafts featured include pottery, blacksmithing, printing, quilting, woodcarving, weaving, leather-working, and much more. Handcrafted items like flame-painted copper jewelry, leather purses and goods, baskets, brooms, stained glass, ironwork, pottery, knives, weaving, quilts, wood carvings, spun yarn, soap, candles, and more are sold Tuesday through Saturday during the open season. Every day that the craft village is open, you can also listen to live music shows on the Blacksmith Stage.

THE HERITAGE HERB GARDEN

The Heritage Herb Garden is a living repository of Ozark knowledge located throughout the Craft Village. The garden areas showcase a collection of pass-along plants, medicinal herbs, native plants, culinary herbs, and old-time vegetables serving as a living classroom for workshops and programming. Plants are available to purchase from the Plant Arbor. The Herb Education Center offers interpretive displays of the plants of the Ozarks and how people have used them. Displays vary with the season. Herb and garden workshops are offered throughout the year with additional events celebrating both culinary and medicinal herbs held in May and October.

CRAFT AND HERB CLASSES

Want to learn a new craft like those in the Craft Village Shops? Craft Classes and Heritage Herb Garden programs are held throughout the year by our master crafts people and herbalists. DINING



LIVE MUSIC & OZARK HIGHLANDS RADIO

Music is at the heart of this park. Fiddle, banjo, guitar, mandolin, dulcimer, and autoharp are just some of the instruments that combine to produce the enduring Ozark Mountain sound.

The Ozark Highlands Theater comfortably seats 1,000 people and the acoustics are excellent for concerts of all types. Concerts are held several times a year featuring Americana, Roots, Folk, Bluegrass, and traditional Old-Time String Bands.
